- **Welcome by Dr. Jeremy Goins, Executive Director of Development -Executive Services**
 - Dr. Jeremy Goins opened the meeting and welcomed everyone.
 - He thanked the Auburndale Middle School Band for sharing their music with us today.
 - He reviewed today's agenda.
 - Interpretation services were available for this meeting.
- **Community Builder by Dr. Jeremy Goins, Executive Director of Development -Executive Services**
 - Attendees were able to partner up and briefly share about their students in our District.
- **Superintendent Updates by Dr. Samuel Buenrostro, Superintendent**

Dr. Buenrostro welcomed everyone. He thanked participants for representing their schools and ensuring that parent voices were being heard. He also thanked his Executive Cabinet for their collaboration and work this year. Dr. Buenrostro said to be blessed to be part of our District which is well known and respected statewide. Dr. Buenrostro provided the following updates:

 - Corona High School was named 2022-23 Project Lead the Way Distinguished School.
 - May is Mental Health Awareness month. We partnered with PTA in their Disconnect to Reconnect Campaign which encourages families to disconnect from their devices for one hour.
 - Santiago High School Boys Lacrosse are Division 2 Champions.
 - Norco High School played Pacifica in the CIF Southern Section Division 1 Girls Softball Playoffs Final.
 - Baron Nguyen competed in the CIF Southern Section Golf Individual Finals.
 - Everyone was invited to attend the District Community Free Ice Cream Party today at 6:30 p.m. The parties will be at El Cerrito Middle School, Chavez Academy, and Corona, Norco and Santiago High Schools.
 - Graduation and promotion ceremonies are upon us. He said the 2023 graduation and eighth grade promotion dates are available on our District's website. We congratulate all students graduating or promoting and wish them the very best. We also want to thank parents for their support.

Lastly, Br. Buenrostro thanked the parents again for their involvement in this council and for their advocacy. He said we greatly appreciate them being messengers to their community of the great work taking place in our District.
- **Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) by Dr. Charla Capps, Administrative Director – Educational Services**
 - The LCAP is a three-year plan that describes the goals, actions, services, and expenditures to support positive student outcomes that address state and local priorities.
 - The LCAP provides an opportunity to share how, what, and why programs and services are selected to meet their local needs.

- The LCAP changed the way they fund districts to allow districts to decide how to allocate funds based on their particular needs, using the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF).
- Funding sources under the LCAP include the LCFF Base Grant, LCFF Supplemental Grant, and LCDD Concentration Grant. This year, we will receive \$53 million in Supplemental funds and additional \$117 million in Concentration funds.
- The LCAP is in alignment with our Strategic Plan, and covers areas of academic excellence, college and career readiness, and student safety and wellbeing, among others.
- The LCAP works similarly to School Plans for Students Student Achievement (SPSA) in that it outlines goals and actions to best serve our students and is monitored by the LCAP Parent Advisory Committee.
- Data measured in the LCAP is gather from the California School Dashboard. Parents can visit the website and view details for each category.
- LCAP includes feedback from educational partners, including the LCAP Parent Advisory Committee, LCAP community survey, student feedback, DELAC and our Superintendent's Parent Advisory Council.
- Actions in the LCAP under academic excellence, college & career readiness, and student safety and wellness were described.
- A safety guard will be placed at each elementary school. At the secondary levels, an additional safety guard will be added.
- **Breakout Groups**
 - Members entered breakout groups and discussed the following questions:
 - *What supports in the LCAP do you value for our students?*
 - *What supports might be missing?*
 - *Any questions?*
 - The following questions/suggestions were submitted:
 - *What is the plan to continue 1 to 1 tech devices and improve upon it?*
 - *Will the unduplicated funding be part of sec?*
 - *Will there be any additional security for high schools?*
 - *Is there a way to monitor online issues with students?*
 - *Title 1 Change for 2023-2024*
 - *Is the increase in unduplicated funding the reason for the district change to make all schools within CNUSD Title 1?*
 - *Can the academic support teachers be used to limit the amount of subs needed for training and other programs that require teachers to be out of class? This can save a lot per school site.*
