


To Intentionally Embarrass, Humiliate,

Threaten or Intimidate an Individual or Group

To Attempt to Gain Power and Control



What Bullying IS and IS NOT

Qualifier	Conflict	Rude	Mean	Bullying
Frequency	REPEATED or pervasive	Occasional	Occasional	REPEATED or pervasive
Intent	INTENTIONAL; in the heat of the moment	Intentional: Spontaneous	Intentional	INTENTIONAL; to enforce social norms
Impact	PROFOUND harm or impact on all parties	Can cause hurt feelings	Can hurt others deeply	PROFOUND harm or impact on the target
Power	FAIR match of power; Intimate Relationship	FAIR or UNFAIR match of power	FAIR or UNFAIR match or power	UNFAIR match of power

- Bystander/Friend/Perpetrator Statements
- Have Other Students Shared the Text, Video Etc.
 At School?
- Has the Cyberbullying Caused School Bullying



Parent Tips - Cyberbullying

- Do Not Erase, Omit or Alter Texts or Emails
 This is Your Evidence
- Copy and Paste the URL and Provide to the School
- Teach "Netiquette" Online Manners
- Teach Them to Be Aware of Trolling Activities and Strategies
- Do Screen Shots of Social Network Sites and Save as Evidence



Regardless of whether colleges look at your social media accounts, your future employers will, and so you should always be mindful and careful about what you post AND what others post on your social media accounts.

Social media is like a tattoo that is always visible no matter what you wear and one that is extremely hard to erase because people can either download content or screenshot things. This can either work to your advantage or against you so be a bit careful about it.








What can **we** do to help you and your student feel safe in the digital world?

What can **we** do to help you and your student feel safe in the digital world?

- What does the school district offer parents to help monitor/track their child's use of their cell phones? Example - Safer Text for iPhones. Is there anything for android and instagram/snapchat.
- Teachers ask kids to download things, sometimes kids want to do it on their phones. How do parents know if it is safe? Parent is pleased with what the district is doing to protect their kids.

- Digital Citizenship training offered and offer more than one time (consider working parent's schedules). A recording option (library).
- Put video together for weekend when off work.

- Better and faster way to take down sites that are bullying
- Train staff on how to deal with these issues. Have a clear way to handle these situations for all classifications
- Let's also remember our special needs kids. How can we support them and educate the parents?
