

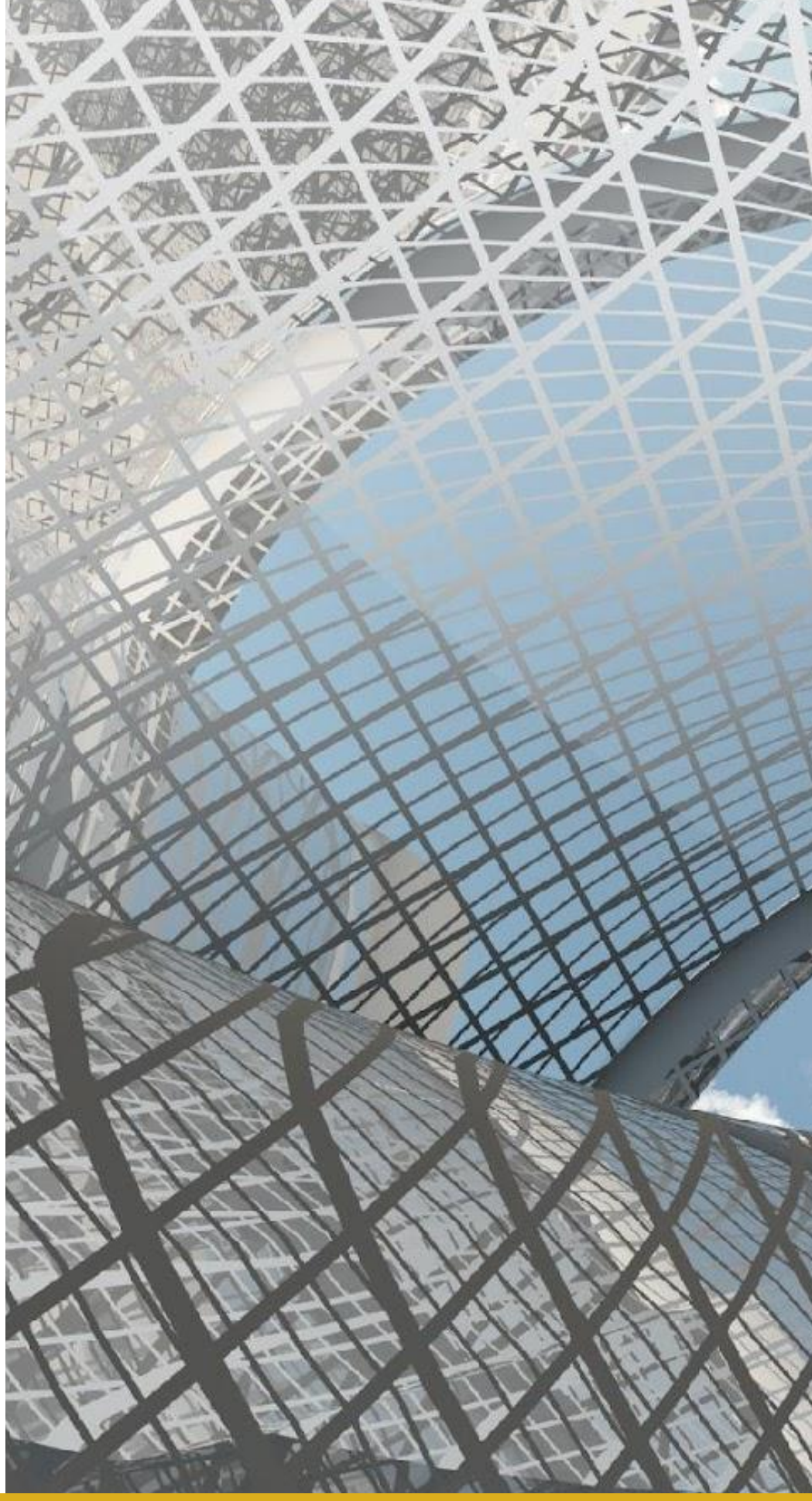

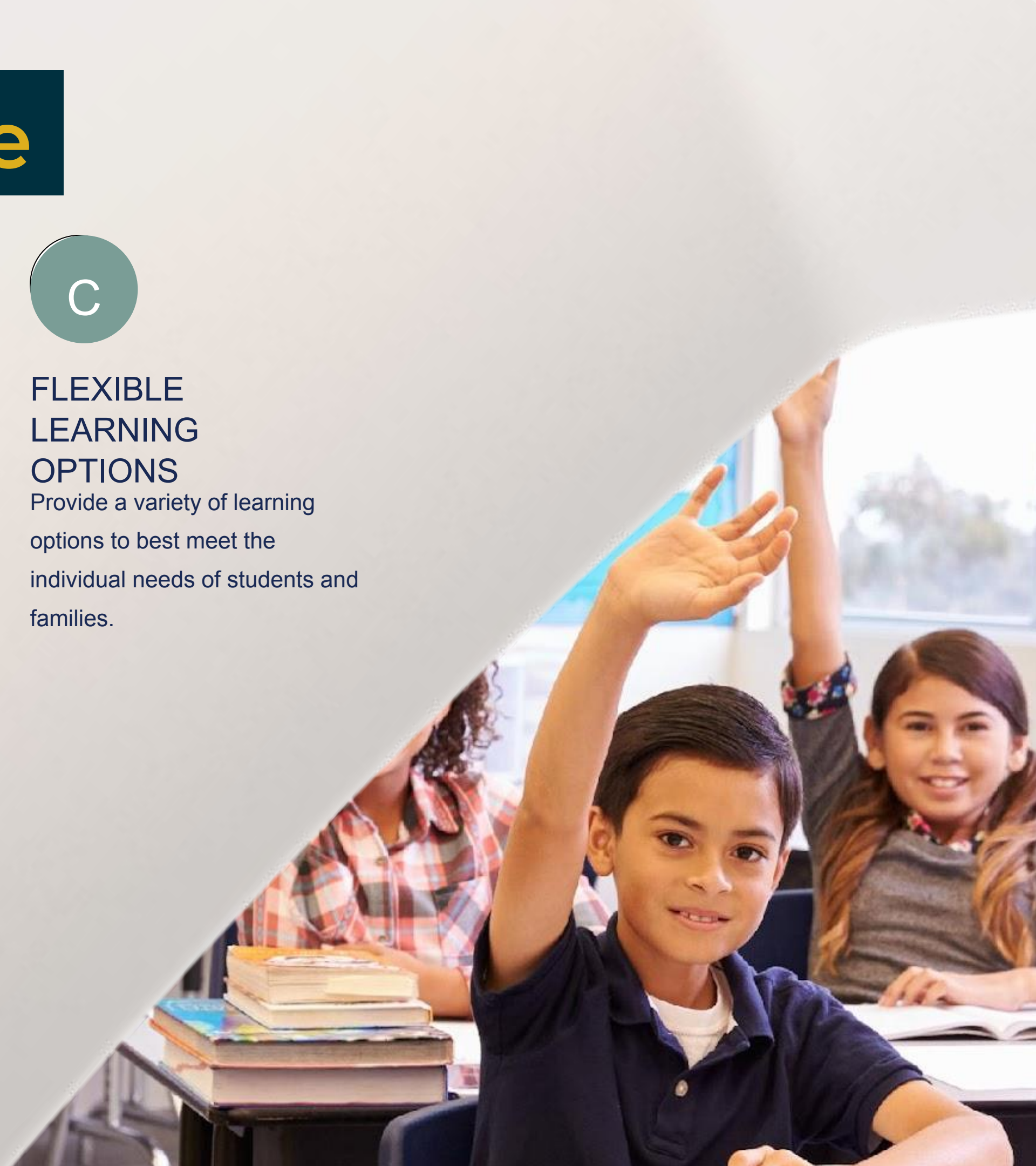

Parent Feedback_Group 1

What items would you like to hear about/discuss during our sessions?

- Information about additional COVID relief funds and how funds will be used
- District security, in general, with emphasis on elementary sites
- Social emotional programs and universal screeners for early interventions provided for students
- How schools assist, support, and/or identify students with special needs.
- Dual Immersion programs - what is available and how are schools determined?
- After school student programs available to assist with after school supervision and/or homework help for working parents

Parent Feedback_Group 2

What items would you like to hear about/discuss during our sessions?

- Safety on Campus. What is the district's safety plan?
- What are the GG funds being used for? Can they be used to help with making our campuses safe?
- Bullying on social media and in person. What is the district doing to prevent bullying?
- How do we monitor cyberbullying?
- What are disciplines for students when they bully others away from campus?
- Can the district support educational programs, assemblies, CTE and STEM presentation, or other programs that can be showcased at all schools throughout the year.
- Can after school care be extended throughout the school district
- Update on the math curriculum. Homework expectations? How long will we be using this program? How will we inform parents on what is happening in the classroom?



Parent Feedback_Group 3

What items would you like to hear about/discuss during our sessions?

- Raney - kids on instagram, looked like a raney account but was not, most were public, some were private - what tools are available for schools to take advantage of. What kind social media tech training is being done with each school to bring down these sites (fights, sexual) hurts all kids on both sides.
- Corona HS PTA Pres - will be going back to his PTSA council and bring back info next time.
- Vicentia - Bullying Prevention Month - more anti bullying talks with their students - 4th grader - homophobic slurs being said - two girls going to bathroom together - what resources does district have to help parents talk to their kids about this. How peers can help each other with this type of issue.
- Prado View - shared a bullying event they are doing next month (assembly being funded by PTA)
- HGS - Important to hear things the district is doing about student emotional issues. Thinks spends too much time on academics. Appreciates this meeting sharing out all activities in the district. The parent academy is great.

Parent Feedback_Group 4

What items would you like to hear about/discuss during our sessions?

- Review on campus and student safety (including digital safety)/ Training for parents
- Deficits in our OT and speech staffing. What are we doing to fill gaps for our students on an IEP?
- How IEP and special education fit into Strategic Plan? Supports for students on IEPs.
- How can we better understand digital policies?
- Diversity Inclusion Plan - How are faculty being engaged? Tools for educators to minimize bullying and be more inclusive.
- COVID-19 mandate vaccine for students, any updates?
- Any plan to integrate the online classroom and physical classroom (example: student out sick and could join classroom from home).
- Students on IEPs and staff consistency. Effects of COVID on student's education. What supports are we and can we provide? Challenging for teachers to differentiate instruction with needs of students. Can we hire more aides or bring parent volunteers in?
- Is the District looking at afterschool program for intermediate students? Afterschool program to assist with homework and after school care at the middle schools is needed.

Parent Feedback_Group 5

What items would you like to hear about/discuss during our sessions?

- School Safety - our approach, preventative measures, educating students and staff
- Equity for students and school district - strategies, highlight what is happening across all the schools
- Publicize our CTE programs with all levels; want to make sure elementary students are aware early on
- School lunches - vendors and inspection teams; how do we know that food is safe and tasty? We want to make sure we have the best options and service for our students
- Anti-bullying programs - how's it going? what does it entail? Is there a committee? How can parents share additional ideas to support anti-bullying around the school district?
- How do middle schools and high schools address technology? cell phones? As a parent, concerns around availability of student technology both Chromebook and their personal device
- How can we address cybersecurity concerns? How can we get more information to keep our students safe online? How can we monitor and prevent our students from accessing certain sites - particularly at the elementary level?
- Ongoing health and safety updates - COVID guidelines
- Ongoing updates around mental health programs - what's new? what's continuing? How are we measuring success?
- How are we reaching out to all parents? How are we educating parents on mental health strategies? We know we have the Parent Center - how else do we reach out? what other methods to raise awareness to families?
