



# What is the Strategic Plan?






#### Our MISSION is to





Ensure that each school in the District operates with consistent baseline service levels for all students and a Multi-Tiered System of Supports.





- COVID-19 mandate vaccine for students, any updates?
- Any plan to integrate the online classroom and physical classroom (example: student out sick and could join classroom from home).
